# PRINCE OF PEACE IRELAND ITINERARY

OCTOBER 22 - 31, 2007

<u>Monday, October 22</u> (Cincinnati – Dublin) Depart from Madison via deluxe motor coach to the Cincinnati International Airport for your overseas Pilgrimage to Dublin, Ireland via overnight transatlantic flight on a scheduled airline.

Tuesday, October 23 (D)(Dublin): Upon arrival in Dublin you will be met by your driver-guide and escort to travel to the city center aboard your deluxe motor coach. We will *celebrate a Mass of Thanksgiving at Dublin's Pro Cathedral* before enjoying an orientation tour of Dublin. See the Georgian Squares and Phoenix Park, the largest people's park in Europe and Trinity College to see the Lost Book of Kells. We then visit the Guinness Storehouse and enjoy a drop of the Black Stuff from the Gravity Bar with its 360 degree view of Dublin. After checking into your hotel the remainder of the day is free to explore the city on your own. You could visit the National Museum, the National Gallery or rest up for the evening events. This evening is a Welcome Dinner hosted by your Irish escort at your hotel. Overnight Dublin.

Wednesday, October 24 (B,L)(Dublin-Girley-Enniskillen): We drive through the town of Trim past the 'Braveheart' movie castle to the village of Girley where we will *Celebrate Mass at the Church of the Immaculate Conception* with the Murtagh family before visiting their farm, *Causey Farm*. The Murtagh's have been farming in this area for over 1,000 years and share their experiences as you become "Irish for A Day." Here you will learn to bake brown bread, watch a sheep dog demonstration and visit the bog to learn about peat as fuel (weather permitting). After a hearty traditional lunch, learn some Irish songs and maybe an Irish dance before bidding farewell to the Murtaghs and departing for the town of Enniskillen, home of our Ulster Project friends. Overnight Enniskillen.

A full hot Irish breakfast is served every morning at the hotel where we are overnight. \*Note: B=breakfast, L=lunch, D=Dinner and is included as indicated for each day.

<sup>\*</sup>This is a tentative Itinerary and is subject to confirmations from many organizations in Ireland. Because of changes in local Irish schedules we may need to alter specified events to better fit the overall plan.

## PRINCE OF PEACE ITINERARY continued

Thursday, October 25 (B)(Enniskillen): Morning Mass at St. Michael's Cathedral. Today we visit the town of Belleek for a tour of the Belleek Pottery Factory to see the craftsmanship that goes into each piece of their world famous bone china. We return to Enniskillen to visit Enniskillen Castle, which stands guard on Lough Erne and tells the story and history of the Inniskilling Fusiliers during WW II. Then it's a relaxing cruise on Lough Erne followed by some free time in town. Tonight the Prince of Peace choir performs with local choirs to raise funds for the Ulster Project. Overnight Enniskillen.

<u>Friday, October 26</u> (B,D)(Enniskillen-Knock-Galway): We bid farewell to our Ulster Project friends as we depart for the town of Knock to *celebrate Mass in the Apparition Chapel*. In 1879 Our Lady appeared to the local people of Knock. This is Ireland's most renowned Marian Shrine. Then it's onward to the city of Galway. Enjoy a brief city tour with the remainder of the day free to explore the city at your leisure. This evening enjoy the included dinner at our hotel. Overnight Galway.

<u>Saturday</u>, October 27 (B)(Galway-Killarney): We depart Galway on our journey to Killarney. Traveling south through the Lunar like landscape of the Burren and then to the Majestic Cliffs of Moher, raising a sheer 700 ft. from the ocean, we continue on to Bunratty Castle and Folk Park where the Ireland of the past is brought to life as you visit the cottages of the people and workers of Ireland's heritage. *Celebrate Mass in St. Mary's Cathedral* this evening in Killarney. You are free tonight to explore the town and have dinner in a local pub or restaurant. Overnight Killarney.

<u>Sunday, October 28</u> (B,D)(Killarney): Today we tour the Dingle Peninsula traveling along Dingle Bay to the fishing town of Dingle and *celebrate Mass at St. Mary's Church*. Continuing along the Dingle Peninsula where the mountains and sky collide you will wind your way along the Atlantic Ocean passing the most westerly point in Europe seeing many of the stone dwellings where the early Christians lived while spreading the word through Ireland. Return to Dingle with free time to have lunch and explore before returning to Killarney. Dinner at the hotel. Overnight in Killarney.

Monday, October 29 (B)(Killarney-Kinsale-Waterford): Traveling today through the Killarney National Park you will see portions of the Ring of Kerry including Molls Gap and Ladies View as we proceed to *Kenmare for Mass*. We continue onward for the harbor town of Kinsale, also known as the gourmet capital of Ireland with time planned here for lunch. Then it's on to Blarney where you may kiss the Blarney Stone which is said to bestow the gift of eloquence. Free time to shop in the Blarney Woolen Mills before we continue to the city of Waterford. Free time in Waterford to explore on your own and dine at one of the many nearby local restaurants for dinner. Overnight Waterford.

<u>Tuesday, October 30</u> (B,D)(Waterford-Dublin): Begin the morning as we *celebrate Mass at St. Joseph and Benildas*. Then Visit the Waterford Crystal factory and showroom for a tour and demonstration of glassblowing. From here we travel to the Wicklow mountains and Glendalough where you will tour the 6<sup>th</sup> century monastic settlement of St. Kevin. Then it's on to Dublin and some free time. Finally a tour of the Jameson Distillery, where John Jameson distilled his famous Irish whiskey followed by a Farewell Dinner Shindig' Evening with traditional music and dance. Overnight Dublin.

<u>Wednesday</u>, October 31 (Dublin-Cincinnati): Transfer to the Dublin airport this morning for your return overseas flight to the US. Note that passengers are split between two flights on the return. Roommates will travel together.
